













to achieve the long-term conservation of nature with associated ecosystem services and cultural values (Dudley 2008).

Proposed Marine Mammal Protected Areas (p-MMPAs).

Ecologically or Biologically Significant Areas (EBSAs) identifying marine mammal habitat through the Convention on Biological Diversity (CBD). EBSAs appear as continuous areas on the map. Some abut or have smaller overlapping sites contained inside but these are not delineated on the map.

National (EEZ) Marine Mammal Sanctuaries (areas declared mainly as "no hunting areas" for cetaceans in the national waters of a country or territory).

Notes: The oceans of the world, as shown on the map, are divided into 18 marine regions according to accepted IUCN World Commission on Protected Areas (WCPA) divisions. Habitat areas that are less than about 2,000 km<sup>2</sup> are shown as points while most areas larger than that are shown as polygons. This map uses a modified Robinson Projection centred on 81° West.
